Easy Pumpkin Pie Recipe

1 1/2 cups pumpkin puree 1/2 cup honey or maple syrup 1/8 teaspoon powdered cloves 1 1/2 tsp cinnamon 3/4 tsp ginger 1/2 tsp salt 2 eggs, slightly beaten 1/2 can evaporated milk (or 1 cup scalded milk)

Mix contents in the order given. Pour into a pie crust. Bake 10 minutes at 450°F; then 40 minutes at 350°F. Serve this tasty dessert with ice cream or whipped cream.
